We will take a pragmatic approach to laying the sediment traps at each sample location in that case and ensure each one is adequate for the individual conditions of that specific section of streambed.

With regards to avoiding salmon spawning season, please be reassured that this has always been a condition of our sampling procedure and we will not carry out any exploration activities within streams between the period of October 31st – May 31st.

To answer your query. It is noted that Dalradian had previously applied for a Section 46 consent which was granted by the Loughs Agency in June 2023. Northern Environment Agency is content that the same conditions and advice received in that consent are followed. The key components of our advice would be that the timing is essential in order to avoid salmon spawning season which is from October 31st to May 31st and that a sediment trap should be placed downstream of every sampling location. With regard to suggested methods, we would suggest a silk curtain or straw bales. However as the use of certain sediment traps and their placement will be site specific, and there are multiple sample sites, we would recommend that Dalradian assess each

site on the ground and decide on the placement and trap depending on the site location and conditions.
