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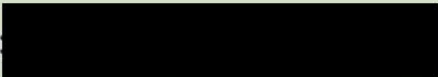

Further Information about proposed felling

Prior to operations being carried out, wildlife checks will be undertaken for protected fauna and their breeding sites such as raptors, bats, otters, red squirrel dreys and badger setts and if found, appropriate action will be taken.

Removing diseased ash and non native species within stands. Creating gaps to encourage natural regeneration and ground flora/ fauna along with replanting of felled coupes with native tree species to improve the native woodland properties of the areas.

Mature trees will be retained if they do not pose a health and safety risk to the public. Many of the woodland boundaries have major and minor road networks, car parks and a golf course in close proximity.

Care will be taken when harvesting close to veteran trees, ground flora and remnant features of ancient woodland. Where necessary a buffer zone will be marked on the ground and in maps. The areas lie adjacent to the Upper Lough Erne Special Area of Conservation (SAC) and ASSI. Thinning operations are unlikely to have an impact. Appropriate log crossing points will be constructed, and brush management will be enforced, Thinning operations will be timed within drier weather to reduce ground damage as predominantly these areas have poor load bearing structure. Extraction routes will be planned to avoid vegetation hot-spots

Remove dead and dying Ash and Sycamore throughout the areas and thin other species to encourage natural regeneration and improve the diversity of the estate woodlands, Areas of clearfell will be replanted with native species.

Blocks 1, 2 and 3 have been identified under the woodland Trust map as Ancient Semi-Natural Woodland. Only dead or dying ash along with sycamore will be removed in these areas while protecting any long-established trees through directional felling. Machinery will be kept to designated harvesting and extraction routes to protect the root systems of standing trees and ground flora. Deadwood will be retained for biodiversity. Beech and Birch will only be removed if beside favoured species such as Oak or along roadsides to provide safety buffers

Further Information about proposed felling

Remove dead and dying ash throughout the areas and thin other species to encourage natural regeneration and improve the diversity of the estate woodlands. Areas of clear-fell will be replanted with native species. Part of Cpt 4 has been identified as Ancient Semi Natural Woodland. Only dead or dying ash will be removed in these areas while protecting any long-established trees through directional felling. Machinery will be kept to designated harvesting and extraction routes to protect the root systems of standing trees and ground flora Deadwood will be retained for biodiversity. Beech, Birch and sycamore will only be removed if beside favoured species such as oak or along roadsides to provide safety buffers. Technically this is classified as a clear-fell because the majority of the woodland is ash, although forest cover will be maintained through the management of other tree species. Cpt 4 is within a Wildlife site – Killadeas Bog. These operations will be timed to minimise the disturbance to the local wildlife. Cpt 5 is adjacent to Lower Lough Erne, no heavy machinery will be working on the lough edge, this is mostly occupied by naturally seeded Birch, Oak and Willow. There is a clearly defined ridge which was most likely the lough level before the water levels were altered by the hydro dam in Ballyshannon. Trees below this will be retained unless they pose a danger (dead ash). Ash, sycamore and large oak occupy the area above, Only ash and sycamore will be removed. Veteran Oaks will be protected during harvesting. NIEA Map Viewer identified breeding waders 1986-87, care will be taken to not disturb any wildlife and buffers from the lough edge of at least 20m will be established.

Prior to operations being carried out, wildlife checks will be undertaken for protected fauna and their breeding sites such as raptors, bats, otters, red squirrel dreys and badger setts and if found, appropriate action will be taken.

Ground flora 'hotspots' will be avoided during operations
