**Please note that the information was requested under the Environmental Permitting Regulations 2016 which are not applicable in Northern Ireland. The sites are however regulated under The Pollution Prevention and Control (Industrial Emissions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2013 and we have responded accordingly.**
