The Department of the Environment in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the Water Act (Northern Ireland) 1972 HEREBY CONSENTS to your making a discharge into an underground stratum in accordance with your application dated 29 March 1985 in respect of your premises at Mulnafye Road, Mountfield, Omagh, as per attached map.

SUBJECT TO the following conditions:

1. The effluent discharged to the underground stratum shall not:
 - (a) contain suspended solids in excess of 120 mgs per litre;
 - (b) exceed 1 cubic metre per day.
2. All surface water shall be excluded from the system.
3. The tank shall be desludged at least once every year

I am contacting you regarding the discharge of sewage effluent from the above mentioned property. As the holder of the above mentioned consent (copy enclosed for ease of reference), you are legally responsible for ensuring that all conditions of consent no. 1442/85 are complied with.

Under the Water (Northern Ireland) Order 1999, (as amended by The Water and Sewerage Services (Northern Ireland) Order 2006), it is a legal requirement to meet the conditions set in a discharge consent. I must advise you that it is an offence to contravene the conditions of the Department's consent.

The consent for your premises authorises a discharge of effluent into an underground stratum (soakaway). Inspections carried out on your premises on 22 September 2015 and 2 October 2015 showed that your system is not installed as consented and is discharging to a piped drain and small sheugh.

A dye test carried out on 2 October 2015 confirmed the pollution in the sheugh is coming from your system.

This is not permitted under the terms of consent no. 1442/85.

The Department is aware that the Water Quality Inspector also spoke to you on the telephone regarding the issue.

You must now take steps to ensure compliance with all conditions of your consent. These steps should include:

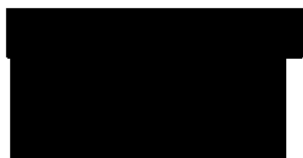

Water (NI) Order consent NC 2212/17 serving Mulnafye Rd Omagh

A recent complaint and inspection in relation to the above mentioned consent to discharge has brought up a number of issues which require your attention. I enclose a copy of the consent for your reference.

The above consent was applied for and granted in March 2018 for the installation of a new sewage treatment plant to replace the old septic tank with associated piped discharge to a waterway south, replacing an old failing soakaway. It appears that the new plant has not yet been installed and you should do so as soon as practicable.

Evidence suggests that the piped discharge is blocked/damaged resulting in flooding/ponding in the lands surrounding. This will need to be repaired to allow free flow of the final effluent from your new plant all the way to the waterway as per consent.

The existing septic tank is full to the top with sludge and what appears to be solid dog waste. You must make immediate arrangement to have this emptied/desludged and ensure that no solid dog waste enters the sewage system from now on.

You contacted us in September 2016 to ask for permission to add this dog waste and were written to advising that the liquid fraction only from your kennel area would be permitted into the tank as long as this did not hydraulically overload the system and result in breach of consent. You must make other arrangements to dispose of the solid dog waste properly. I enclose a copy of that letter for your reference.

Prior to your application for consent in November 2015 a solicitor acting for yourself contacted us asking for confirmations regarding the intended route of effluent discharge from your new plant to the waterway. I enclose that letter and our reply for your reference. In essence our response stated that the route noted A-B could be used as long as a plant suitable for the receiving waterway was installed and maintained to ensure no future pollution. This in turn is what you made application for.



Our permission does not confer title or act as any right of way. Land access and rights of way remain outside the remit of this Department. Where lands not in the permission of the applicant or outside the folio boundary are to be used in connection with a sewage system and/or associated drainage/discharge, a legal agreement should be obtained in relation to these lands. This agreement must ensure that the lands in question will always be available for the intended purpose and also that any occupier/owner of the consented property will have access to these lands for maintenance/improvement work as required. It is up to the applicant to ensure that these permissions are in place at time of application.

It has come to our attention that correct rights of way and/or permissions may not have been properly arranged which is a wholly civil matter for the two parties. We recommend that you work with your neighbour to resolve these issues. Desludge of the tank is recommended immediately to prevent further pollution of the surrounding area. Contact NI Water on 03457440088 to arrange a free, once yearly, desludge and confirm this in writing by reply.

This Department will continue to require compliance with the consent as granted and you should take action as soon as practicable to comply, installing the plant and repairing pipework as stated in the consent.

As the holder of the above mentioned consent you are legally responsible for ensuring that all conditions are complied with. I must advise you that it is an offence under the Water Order 1999 to contravene the conditions of the Department's consent.

If a different sewage disposal system is agreed by the two parties, a new application will be required well in advance of installation.
