Guidance Notes for AIPM 4

Note: this form should only be used to record information for a single premises/ site. Information about additional premises should be provided on separate AIPM 4 forms and returned along with this form.

All applicants should already be a member of a DAERA Business.

Please submit a separate application if you are not already a DAERA Business member.

If you are registering a commercial laying hen establishment, you will also have to register separately with DAERA Agri-Food Inspection Branch (AfIB) Eggs Team as an Egg Production Establishment. 1. General Information

- a) **Person in day-to-day charge:** Person responsible (on permanent or temporary basis) for daily control of birds and aware of any production problems. Letters about the birds or bird disease will be addressed to this person. If there is a NIPHAS or an EC Egg Layer Establishment Registration Code (Egg Marketing Code) associated with the birds at this address, write it in the space provided.
- b) **Place where the birds are kept:** If you do not keep birds at the address given at part (a) then enter the postal address of the production site, bird house or piece of land where the birds are kept. If there is a NIPHAS or an EC Egg Layer Establishment Registration Code (Egg Marketing Code) associated with the birds at this address, write it in the space provided.
- c) **Site Owner** (If different from the keeper). In cases where the day-to-day keeper is not the owner of the site where the birds are kept. Otherwise enter N/A
- d) **Owner name and address:** *(If different from the keeper)* in case of urgent need for a responsible person to be contacted concerning the flock and the keeper cannot be contacted. Otherwise enter N/A
- e) **Herd/flock numbers for animals held by person in day-to-day charge of birds:** Complete all details as appropriate or enter N/A if no other animals kept.
- f) **Any other existing poultry establishments:** If there are any other existing poultry establishments operated on the same site as the proposed new establishment, whether by the same or a different keeper, provide details here. Otherwise enter N/A.

2. **Biosecurity Questions:** Some information required in relation to the risk of Avian Influenza or other infectious disease to your flock. You are asked to note if you have a contingency

plan in place in the event of an increased risk of disease such as Avian Influenza, you do not have to include the details of any such plan in your application.

- 3. Information Concerning Buildings and Birds:** Include the exact coordinates of each building to allow us to identify the exact location for mapping purposes. You can find this by clicking on the house on google maps or other mapping applications. If you are linked with a poultry company which uses unique identifiers for individual houses, record for each house. If a building is split internally into separate houses, each with its own bird group, record this. Enter the area of each house. Indicate all types of birds kept. Give the maximum number of each type of birds at any one time for each house in which they are kept and the overall maximum number of each type of birds (total).
- 4. Purpose for keeping birds:** Mark “Yes” box if all birds are kept: for your own consumption; for your own use; as pets; or as a zoo or for educational purposes, and proceed to question 5. Mark No box if the birds are kept for any other purpose, and proceed to question 6.

Mark as appropriate:

Hobby/Racing: Birds kept for interest or racing, or for production of meat or eggs for personal use.

Rare breed: Birds of exceptional genetic merit; kept in breed groups, may be shown or exhibited.

Zoo/Educational: Birds kept in a DAERA/NIEA licensed zoo or for educational purposes.

- producing eggs which will go to a hatchery to become parent breeders (grandparent breeders); or
- being reared to become parent or grandparent breeders or to become birds producing meat for human consumption.

Stage in Chain *Mark all that apply:*

Grandparent breeder: Lay eggs that are hatched and the day olds are then grown on to become parent breeders.

Grandparent breeder rearer: Grows birds from day old which will become Grandparent breeders.

Parent breeder: Lay eggs that are hatched and either the day olds are grown on to produce eggs for human consumption or the day-olds are grown on to produce meat for human consumption.

Parent breeder rearer: Grows birds from day old that will become Parent breeders.

Broiler grower: Grows birds from a day old and then moves them on to be finished for human consumption by a broiler finisher.

Broiler finisher: Grows birds from day-old or older and finishes them for slaughter for human consumption.

Turkey Poult grower: Grows turkey poults and then moves them on to be finished for human consumption by a turkey finisher.

Turkey finisher: Grows birds from day-old or older and finishes them for slaughter for human consumption.

Commercial Egg layer: Hens that are laying eggs for human consumption.

Commercial Pullet rearer: Raises pullets from day old to point of lay.

Hatchery: Taking in eggs from parent/grandparent breeder flocks, sending out day-old birds or hatching eggs.

Rearer/Layer -other: Birds other than hens that lay eggs for human consumption. For example, ducks, quail.

Grower/Finisher - other: Grows young birds (other than broiler chickens or turkeys) and/or fattens birds (other than broiler chickens or turkeys) for human consumption. For example ducks, geese, quail.

Free Range: Complies with range requirements of EU Marketing Regulations and/or Organic Regulations.

Barn: Complies with Barn criteria in EU Egg Marketing Regulations or with Barn/Extensive

Indoor criteria in EU Poultry meat Marketing Regulations.

Caged: Complies with Enriched Cage criteria in EU Egg Marketing Regulations.

Housed at all times: Live entirely indoors.
