Thank you for your email correspondence received by the Department on 3 May 2026, in which you requested statistical information held in respect of what the average farm business receives under the current support system, in comparison to the previous one. You also asked how much these support schemes cost to administer.

As outlined in our response issued to you on 29 May 2026, the Department carried out a search of records and confirmed it holds some of the information related to your request.

Since the original response was issued the Department has now received some further information that falls within the scope of your request. As such, the original response has now been updated to properly reflect the information held regarding the current support scheme for farmers in comparison to the previous one and the costs of administering the current support framework.

I have responded to your questions in the order listed.

1. The average annual direct farm support payment per farm business for the final year of the previous scheme, and the most recent available average annual payment per farm business under the current scheme. Alongside this, provide the monetary difference between the two figures and the percentage change.

The current support payments paid to farm businesses changed in the financial year 2025/26 from the Basic Payment Scheme to the Farm Sustainability Transitional Payment. The table below sets out the average annual payment in 2024/25 as opposed to 2025/26 under the new scheme.

*Payment includes items that were actually paid or due to be paid for that year. Some of the new larger schemes for 2025/26 are only being paid now in June 2026. Included are other items that are in the process of being paid but have been delayed due to probate and incorrect banking details.

2. The total annual administrative cost to the Department of delivering the final year of the previous farm support scheme, and the most recent total annual administrative cost of delivering the current support framework. The total annual administrative cost to the Department of delivering the current and prior farm support scheme years is set out in the table below.

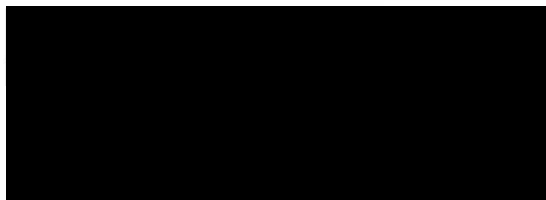
