Environmental Information Regulation 2004

With regard to your request for information, received by the Department on 29 April 2026, which sought the following information:

You requested access to environmental records concerning the following location:
Global Trek Aviation – Belfast International Airport (BFS), 18 Seacash Road,
Crumlin, BT29 4DN / BT29 4DL, United Kingdom

Specifically, you said that you were interested in:

- Records of hazardous spills, fuel releases, or pollution incidents
- Details of underground or aboveground storage tanks
- Site inspections, compliance reports, and enforcement actions
- Environmental permits and associated documentation
- Any site investigations, risk assessments, or remediation activities

I can advise that the Department has completed its search and can confirm that it holds a limited amount of information on Global Trek Aviation.

Under Article 23(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2024/590 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 7 February 2024 on substances that deplete the ozone layer, an annual assessment of halon users is carried out.

Global Trek Aviation was identified as a possible user of halons due to the nature of their business. However, when they were contacted for the 2022 reporting year in 2023, they stated that they did not use halons and did not intend to use any in the future.

The supply of information in response to a freedom of information request does not confer an automatic right to re-use the information.
