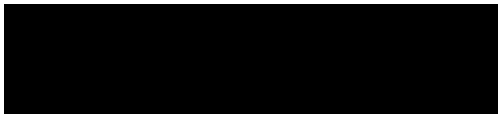

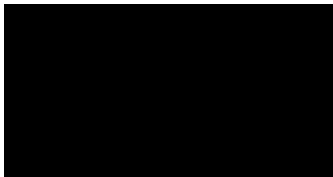

The Public Health Agency has considered the above application and wishes to make the following comments based on the information available within the application documents.

I note this application is in respect of a variation to an existing permit. The activity concerned is broiler rearing with a proposed increase of 139,000 birds to a total of 274,000 poultry.

You will be aware that such facilities have a theoretical potential to cause adverse health effects from exposure to particulate matter (PMT), ammonia, general dust and other emissions. In general, however, the likelihood of significant harm from general environmental exposure is very low, except where there is prolonged exposure to these pollutants at a high concentration level.

The main determinant of "exposure dose" for any given farm production site, is distance between receptors/individuals and the emission site. A harmful exposure level would require potential receptor/individuals to live within a relatively short distance of the production site.

From a Public Health perspective, this must assume a low threshold for public safety, although the likelihood of harm is remote for most members of the public, we cannot exclude an increased risk for people living in close proximity of such facilities.

Taking account of the above and the specific information provided within the application, we note that there appear to be at least three dwellings located within 250 metres of the facility. The nearest such dwelling is within 85 metres. We are therefore concerned that there may be potential adverse health effects associated with this facility, particularly for the occupants of those dwellings closest to the facility.

However, I would ask you to note that no comments are offered with regard to occupational exposure relating to those who may work within the facility and the above advice assumes that there is no change to the present configuration of private dwellings in the vicinity of the production site.

We should also point out that in the event of any outbreak of infectious/non infectious disease in the area at any time in the future, that the Public Health Agency would be obliged to conduct an epidemiological investigation regardless of whether or not this is deemed to be associated with the facility.

The above advice is subject to review in the light of future advances in knowledge of the Public Health implications of these facilities.

The Public Health Agency has considered the above application and wishes to make the following comments based on the information available within the application.

This application is to support a variation to an existing permit to construct 2 additional broiler houses with the capacity for 44,000 birds each, increasing capacity from 74,000 to 162,000 broiler birds. These will be located on the land adjacent to the existing installation which has 2 broiler houses at lands approximately 250m Northwest of 7 Terryscollop Road, Dungannon, Co. Tyrone, BT71 7QQ. There are 6 residential properties within a radius of approximately 500m of the development.

Such facilities have a theoretical potential to cause adverse human health effects from but not limited to exposure to odour, dust, ammonia and noise.
