Options for Basic Payment Scheme Entitlement Unit Values Post 2019: Stakeholder Engagement

I am writing to bring your attention to the above stakeholder engagement exercise which the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs (DAERA) has issued to seek views on potential Options for Basic Payment Scheme (BPS) Entitlement Unit Values Post 2019.

This follows a stakeholder engagement exercise last year on a possible high-level framework for agricultural policy in Northern Ireland following the UK's exit from the EU. The BPS provides direct support to farmers under Pillar 1 of the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP). It is assumed that post 2019, direct support will operate under EU retained legislation/domestic legislation (UK Agriculture Bill, Statutory Instruments and Statutory Regulations). This will provide DAERA with the legal authority to maintain the *status quo* (i.e. implement direct support payments as if they are still operating under EU rules) post 2019 until such times as a future Minister decides to make changes or introduces a new agricultural policy framework for Northern Ireland.

The unit value of entitlements under the current BPS has been progressing in equal annual steps since 2015 towards achieving a flat rate per hectare by 2021. Guidance issued to farmers in 2015 made clear that arrangements after the 2019 Scheme Year would depend on future EU CAP Reform decisions. The engagement exercise last year gave a commitment at the time to engaging on potential options for BPS entitlement unit values post 2019.

This current stakeholder engagement document outlines the background to how unit values were calculated; why they are paid at different rates; the progression to date towards payment at a flat rate; and seeks views on two potential options:

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- Continue the transition towards a flat rate payment by 2021; or
- Freeze the unit value of the entitlements at the end of 2019.

During this exercise, DAERA will not in any way prejudge or constrain the ability of an incoming Minister, NI Executive and NI Assembly to decide what is appropriate for Northern Ireland's agriculture industry.
