These regulations amend the Registration of Fish Buyers and Sellers and Designation of Fish Auction Sites Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005 to update references to EU legislation. There are no policy changes.

Aims and objectives of the policy / decision to be screened:-

The Regulations are intended to provide for the effective administration and enforcement of an EU system to register buyers and sellers of first sale fish and fish auction sites in NI. The 2005 Regulations are currently no enforceable due to references to obsolete EU legislation. The amendments replace old references with references to appropriate Articles in the EU Fisheries Control Regulation (EC 1224/2009).
