Scope

• The purpose of this bulletin is to make stakeholders in Northern Ireland aware that Philippines Department of Agriculture has lifted the temporary ban on the importation of live cattle, bovine meat and meat products from the UK.

- Restoration of this trade means that NI stakeholders can resume use of particular Export Health Certificates from <u>DEFRA's Form Finder</u> website when making their applications via the <u>DAERA DECOL system</u>.
- NI exporters can now:
 - Resume applications for the export of Beef using <u>EHC 8055</u>
 - Resume applications for the export of Bovine Blood using <u>EHC 8127</u>
 - Resume applications for the export of Pet Food containing beef /beef products using <u>EHC 8076</u>
- Please Note: Only products derived from animals slaughtered *after* the date of the lifting of ban (23rd March 2022) will be eligible.
