TPG1 for the purpose of preserving public health or public safety.

TPG2 for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease and preventing serious damage to livestock, foodstuffs for livestock, crops, vegetables, fruit, growing timber and fisheries.

TPG3 for the purpose of conserving wild birds.

These licences apply to widely spread species which vary by licence type but in 2022 included Hooded Crow, Jackdaw, Magpie, Rook, Feral Pigeon, Wood Pigeon, *Sustainability* at the heart of a living, working, active landscape valued by everyone.


House Sparrow and Starling. The general licences do not specify a limit on numbers of birds killed.
