## Specification

- 'Tree pollarding' must be carried out by a suitably qualified chainsaw operator/tree surgeon (see Further Advice web link);
- 'Tree pollarding' must be carried out between 1<sup>st</sup> September and 28<sup>th</sup> /29<sup>th</sup> February; and
- the tree pollarding must be completed as detailed in the ssRMP.

## Consents:

If a tree is protected by a Tree Preservation Order (TPO), the Local Council's consent is required before it may be pruned. Your local area planning office will be able to provide information on protected trees and the location of conservation areas in your area.
