¹ A pet rabbit/rodent is an animal travelling with its owner for the purpose of a holiday or a change of residence, with no intended change of ownership involved (selling/gifting/re-homing). The animals may also travel with a person authorised in writing by the owner, as long as that movement is within 5 days of the owners movement. If you require information on a commercial (travelling to rehome/gift/sell) or unaccompanied (owner not travelling with the animal) movement, please contact tradeadminpost@daera-ni.gov.uk. Pet rabbits are those that are not intended for food production.

² These listed countries are: Andorra, Switzerland, Faeroe Islands, Gibraltar, Greenland, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Vatican City State

³ Up to 5 pet animals may travel per person.

⁴ The animal should be micro-chipped or otherwise identified if possible. If this is not possible for that species, then it should be described in such a way as to establish a clear link between the animal and this document.

⁵ Any health information the veterinarian thinks is relevant in relation to infectious diseases, in particular notifiable disease or infectious/contagious disease, or the suitability of this animal for travel.

Pet rabbits and pet rodents entering Northern Ireland from the UK may undergo a random spot compliance check on arrival.

This document must travel with the pet rabbits and pet rodents as a veterinary health certificate, and must be presented at the compliance check. If your pet fails its compliance check, your pet may be quarantined or returned to the country of origin at your expense.
