

The low Rickety Bridge




Sixteen lengths of chain were used to build the low Rickety Bridge

How much did all the lengths of chain for the low Rickety Bridge cost?




Can you make a paper strip the same length as a length of chain on the low Rickety Bridge? Now find something in your classroom that is the same length as your paper strip.

The 19 letters on the Peace Bell cost 10p each to carve.


What was the total cost of the letters?
