Balloo Wetland / Woodland Restoration Project

Aims of the project

- To undertake restoration works in the wetland that will help improve the water quality and the ecological status/potential of the water body
- To remove the invasive floating pennywort from the pond in the woodland.



Why project was needed



- Regulation of flow: - reduce the amount of vegetation and increase open water on site
- The site is in an urban industrial area and the stream carries pollutants / sediments into the wetland habitats
- Proximity to Ballyholme and Crawfordsburn Rivers would suggest that the stream would fail on similar elements – both bad for fish and benthic invertebrates
- Presence of floating pennywort in woodland

Contribution to River Basin Management Plans



- Heavy landscaping works to restore ponds and enhance habitats for fish and benthic invertebrates
- Retaining vegetation for attenuation and treatment of pollutants – reducing amount of pollution reaching Belfast Lough
- Removal of invasive species in woodland – floating pennywort
